[Findhelp.org](https://www.findhelp.org) (formerly Aunt Bertha) - Helps you find low-cost or free support with things like money assistance, finding food, or getting medical care.



[United Way 2-1-1](https://www.211.org) - Connects you with assistance with paying bills, finding a place to live, or joining after-school programs by calling 211 or texting your zip code to 898-211. They can connect you with someone who can help.



[Rx Assist](https://www.rxassist.org) - Allows you to type in your medicines to save money and find help.



[Needy Meds](https://www.needy-meds.org) - Assists you if you cannot pay for your medicines and health care.
